As a Project Superintendent, Mr. Minuto has over 16 years of field project and management experience in the construction and environmental remediation fields. Entering into the construction field in 1990 as a laborer he quickly rose through the ranks becoming a foreman in 1992 and eventually a Superintendent in 2001.

He is involved in all phases of gas and electric installation for major utilities in the New York Metropolitan area and has worked on numerous Hazardous Waste clean up projects including the September 11, 2001 World Trade Center Terrorist attack site in Manhattan for Con Edison .
